Agenda Item Four: Public Comments

- a. Cindy Pinkerton: Mrs. Pinkerton requested the council put resurfacing Lake Street at the top of the list for streets. Mrs. Pinkerton pointed out that 4 feet of each side of the street is overgrown with grass.
- b. Jeff Sofich: Mr. Sofich congratulated the newly elected officials. He voiced his appreciation for the work that Allan Whatley and his crew does with what equipment they have. He informed the council that he spends more money in a night on drinks and food than what the city workers get paid in a day. Mr. Sofich recommended taking the salary for a building inspector and give it to the Mr. Whatley's crew. He made recommendations the city council members to get together to come up with solutions to make the citizens better for the City of Jefferson better so the city can be cleaned up. Mr. Sofich offered to pay the freight on any piece of equipment within in the United States that Mr. Whatley's crew needs and that the city has budgeted for, so the work can be done right. Mr. Sofich asked that aldermen return calls to citizens.
- c. Eugene Jenkins: Mr. Jenkins informed the council that when it rains, Rusk Street holds water and asked the council to consider paving it.
- d. Jim Stacey: Mr. Stacey thanked the outgoing aldermen for their service. Mr. Stacey acknowledged a successful Pilgrimage weekend and Woofstock event. He would like to see council participate in more events. He mentioned a business that has been found to have not been paying taxes for a number of years and would like the city to do an investigation on the tax office to see if any other entities haven't been paying taxes. He is hoping the city will look into and be more active in reconfirming where the city limits are. He would like to see the city thing twice before conveying streets to private individuals because of drainage issues.
- e. Lagene Smoak: Mrs. Smoak stated that Lake Street was last surfaced in the 1970's. When the new water lines were installed, the residents were told it would be fixed but it wasn't. She

- would like to know why their streets keep getting pushed back when other streets that don't have high traffic or houses facing them are being re-surfaced.
- f. Kaye Cannon: Mrs. Cannon informed the council that at the intersection of Austin Street and Marshall Street, there are bushes and brush near the stop sign that needs maintained more regularly because it is difficult to see oncoming traffic. The extra entrance next to the nature trail by the alley and her place on Camp St. has two trees that need the weeds around them.








The building Permit rate for any new construction or remodel with a value of \$5,000.00 or greater, whether interior or exterior, shall be $\frac{1}{2}$ or $\frac{1}{6}$ of the construction cost, i.e. $\frac{0.005}{1}$ construction cost. For example, the fee for a \$50,000.00 project is \$250.00. The minimum fee is \$50.00.

The building permit application will also now include information for sprinkler/irrigation systems.

The fee for demolition of any structure great than 500 square feet is \$100.00.

The fee for moving and or relocation of any structure to a different location is \$100.00. Relocation of a structure to a different location on the same or adjoining property would be exempt from any fee. In either case, the person moving the structure would also be required to reimburse the City for any expenses incurred by the City in conjunction with the move.

On the last page of the Building Permit Guideline Package, you will find a Customer Inspection Guide. This is a guideline only and not to be filled out by the plumber, if applicable. Rather, it must be returned to City Hall along with the rest of the application.

Upon the completion of plumbing of any structure that will require city water and/or sewer services, by law the Customer Service Inspector must perform a City Service Inspection on said plumbing.

Failure to comply with the Customer Service Guideline may result in termination of existing service or denial of future city services.

ORDINANCE NO. 02-12

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BUILDING PERMIT ORDINANCE OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF JEFFERSON, TEXAS, BY ADDING A NEW SECTION THAT ESTABLISHES THE LOCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR BUILDINGS IN ESTABLISHED RESIDENTIAL AREAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JEFFERSON, TEXAS:

That Chapter 18 Article II of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jefferson is hereby amended by the addition of section 18-86 there to which shall read in its entirety as follows:

SECTION 18-86 BUILDING LOCATION

Buildings built on site or moved into an established Residential area must have a minimum setback from the street property line of 25 ft. or be located on the established building line of the other housing on the street which it fronts. The minimum side yard setback requirement is 5 ft. from the property line and the minimum back yard setback from the property line is 10 ft.





The building Permit rate for any new construction or remodel with a value of \$5,000.00 or greater, whether interior or exterior, shall be $\frac{1}{2}$ or 1% of the construction cost, i.e. 0.005* construction cost. For example, the fee for a \$50,000.00 project is \$250.00. The minimum fee is \$50.00.

The building permit application will also now include information for sprinkler/irrigation systems.

The fee for demolition of any structure great than 500 square feet is \$100.00.

The fee for moving and or relocation of any structure to a different location is \$100.00. Relocation of a structure to a different location on the same or adjoining property would be exempt from any fee. In either case, the person moving the structure would also be required to reimburse the City for any expenses incurred by the City in conjunction with the move.

On the last page of the Building Permit Guideline Package, you will find a Customer Inspection Guide. This is a guideline only and not to be filled out by the plumber, if applicable. Rather, it must be returned to City Hall along with the rest of the application.

Upon the completion of plumbing of any structure that will require city water and/or sewer services, by law the Customer Service Inspector must perform a City Service Inspection on said plumbing.

Failure to comply with the Customer Service Guideline may result in termination of existing service or denial of future city services.

Suggested new wording for Building Permit Ordinance Section 18-86

Buildings built on site or moved into an established or designated Residential area must have a minimum of 25 ft. setback requirement from any street property line or be located on the established building line of other housing on the street. This established building line exception only applies to building frontage - no side building line exception will be allowed. The minimum side setback requirement is 5 ft. from an adjoining property line or alleyway. The minimum back setback requirement is 10 ft. from an adjoining property line or alleyway. A building site plot plan must be submitted as part of a Building Permit application- both Residential and Commercial. No building construction will be allowed until approval of the Building Permit.


1897 HOWE TRUSS TRAIN TRESTLE

IN THE MID-1800s, JEFFERSON WAS REGARDED AS THE STEAMBOAT ENTRY PORT INTO TEXAS. WHEN THE ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS CLEARED THE RED RIVER RAFT, THE WATER LEVEL NEAR JEFFERSON FELL AND STEAMBOATS COULD NO LONGER REACH THE TOWN YEAR-ROUND. IN 1873, JEFFERSON WAS FIRST CONNECTED TO THE NATIONAL RAIL NETWORK THROUGH THE TEXAS AND PACIFIC RAILWAY.

IN THE 1890s, THE SHERMAN, SHREVEPORT AND SOUTHERN RAILWAY BUILT TRACKS EAST FROM JEFFERSON TO THE TEXAS-LOUISIANA STATE LINE. THIS RAILWAY WAS LATER ACQUIRED BY THE MISSOURI-KANSAS-TEXAS SYSTEM. THE FIRST BRIDGE OVER BIG CYPRESS BAYOU WAS A WOODEN TRESTLE. IN 1907 AN IRON BRIDGE, BUILT IN 1897 BY THE PHOENIX BRIDGE COMPANY OF PHOENIXVILLE, PENNSYLVANIA, WAS INSTALLED HERE. THIS BRIDGE ALLOWED FOR COMMERCIAL AND PRIVATE TRAINS TO CROSS HIGH ABOVE THE WATER. AMERICAN ARCHITECT AND BRIDGE BUILDER WILLIAM HOWE (1803-1852) PATENTED THE "HOWE TRUSS BRIDGE" IN 1840. A TRUSS BRIDGE IS A LOAD-BEARING STRUCTURE OF CONNECTED ELEMENTS USUALLY FORMING TRIANGULAR UNITS. HOWE'S BRIDGE IS COMPOSED OF DIAGONAL STRUCTURAL BEAMS THAT SLOPE TOWARDS THE CENTER IN COMPRESSION WITH THE VERTICAL WEB MEMBERS IN TENSION. THEY ARE REPRESENTATIVE OF COMMON BRIDGE TYPES OF THE 20TH CENTURY.

THE BRIDGE WAS DECOMMISSIONED IN 1992 WHEN A NEWER BRIDGE WAS BUILT TO THE EAST. THE KANSAS CITY SOUTHERN RAILWAY COMPANY WHICH THEN OWNED THE BRIDGE DONATED IT TO MARION COUNTY. AS ONE OF THE LAST REMAINING IRON HOWE TRUSS RAILROAD BRIDGES IN THE UNITED STATES ACCESSIBLE FOR PUBLIC VIEW, IT IS NO LONGER IN USE BUT STANDS AS A BACKDROP FOR THE PORT JEFFERSON HISTORY AND NATURE CENTER.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE JEFFERSON HISTORIC DISTRICT AND DEFINING THE BOUNDRIES OF THE JEFFERSON HISTORIC DISTRICT WITHIN THE CITY OF JEFFERSON, TEXAS.

WHEREAS, the United States Department of the Interior's National Park Service established the Jefferson Historic District in the National Register of Historic Places on March 31, 1971.

WHEREAS, the governing body of the City of Jefferson desires to formally and officially designate the area listed as Entry Number 71.3.48.0022 in the National Register of Historic Places as the Jefferson Historic District.

Now, therefore, be it ordained by the governing body of the City of Jefferson, Texas:

Section 1

That the area designated in the National Register of Historic Places, Entry Number 71.3.48.0022 on March 31, 1971, by the United States Department of the Interior's National Park Service as the Jefferson Historic District shall be formally and officially designated by the governing body of the City of Jefferson by this ordinance as the Jefferson Historic District.

Section 2

The Jefferson Historic District shall be described by the following metes and bounds survey, which encompasses the entire Jefferson Historic District:

Beginning at the northwest corner at the intersection of longitude 94° 21' 13" and latitude 32° 45' 40", on Owens beginning at a point on the southwestern corner of Lot 3 and northwestern corner of Block 46 in the Alley Addition, south on Owens to the alley between Walker and Baker, east one block to Friou and south to Taylor, east on Taylor to Bridge Street, south one half block to the alley, east to Line Street, then northeast two blocks to Market, southeast on Market to Camp, and northeast to the bayou, north up the center of the bayou to a line extending northwest to Walnut Street, northwest on Walnut to LaFayette, southwest one block on LaFayette to Polk, northwest one and a half blocks to the alley between Henderson and Orleans, southwest one block to Vale, northwest one and a half blocks to Line, north one half block to the alley between Walker and Dixon, thence along the alley three and a half blocks to the alley between Friou and Alley Streets, north one block to the alley between Dixon and Broadway, and west to the point of origin on Owens. The District is inscribed in a rectangle formed by the latitudes 32° 45' 40" and 32° 45' 14" and longitudes 94° 21' 13" and 94° 20' 31".

In addition, the City of Jefferson adopts the map of the Jefferson Historic District that was created for the 1971 National Register of Historic Places that has been attached, and this map shall become part of the ordinance.

Section 3

The City of Jefferson reserves the right under Chapter 211 of the Texas Local Government Code to make further provisions to promote the economic, cultural, educational, and general welfare of the public. This act is intended to:

- (a) protect and enhance the landmarks and districts which represent distinctive elements of Jefferson's historical, architectural, and cultural heritage;
- (b) foster civic pride in the accomplishments of the past;
- (c) protect and enhance Jefferson's attractiveness to visitors and the support and stimulus to the economy thereby provided;
- (d) insure the harmonious, orderly, and efficient growth and development of the city that is sensitive to its historic resources;
- (e) promote economic prosperity and welfare of the community by encouraging the most appropriate use of historic properties within the city; and
- (f) encourage stabilization, restoration, and improvements of such properties and their values by offering incentives for rehabilitation.

Section 4 – Effective Date

This ordinance shall become effective after passage.
